WINSLOW, ANTHONY, in the text, m. 1729. EBENEZER, Petersham, son of Kenelm, below, m., 1773, Rebecca Dean, of Dedham, and had Susanna, 1774, m. William Thompson, of New Braintree; Ebenezer, 1778; Leonard, 1782; Rebecca, 1785, m. John Washburn; Lucretia, 1787. EBENEZER, Petersham, son of above, m. Nancy Aldrich, of Petersham, and had Simeon Aldrich. EDWARD, 2d in the text; d. Elizabeth m. Robert Brooks. EDWARD, 3d in the text, was Collector of the Port of Plymouth, Register of Probate and Clerk of the Pleas. Being a loyalist he was deprived of his offices in 1775; and in December, 1781, joined the British garrison in New York with a part of his family, the remainder joining him later. Sir Henry Clinton allowed him a pension of two hundred pounds per annum, with rations and fuel. On the 13th of August, 1783, with wife, two daughters and three colored servants he sailed for Halifax, reaching there September 14th. He died in Halifax in 1784. EDWARD, 4th in the text, son of above; son John Francis Wentworth born 1793. He was associated with his father in his various offices. He joined the British in Boston, and went to Lexington with Lord Percy April 19, 1775. He was appointed by General Gage Collector of Boston and Suffolk Register of Probate, going to Halifax at the time of the evacuation of Boston, and was made there, by Sir William Howe, Secretary of the Board of General Officers, of which Lord Percy was President, for distribution of donations to the troops. Later he went to New York, and was appointed Muster Master General of the forces, and remained in the States in that capacity during the war. In 1779 he was chosen by Refugees in Rhode Island to command them, and served during two campaigns. He was Military Secretary in Halifax after the war till 1785, when he went to New Brunswick as one of the King's Council and Paymaster of Contingencies. He died in Frederickton, N. B., in 1815.
